Commentary

The overall 'barriers to housing and services' measure for Sussex is high by national standards. Sussex is ranked 19 out of 47 sub regions, placing it in the top 40%. However, last year Sussex was ranked higher at 8 overall, which shows that housing deprivation has lowered relative to other sub regions.

Within Sussex, seven districts have higher than average levels of barriers to housing and services, compared to 11 in the previous IMD.
