Commentary

The table here shows the number of LSOAs in each district which are in the three most deprived deciles (i.e. 0-10%, 11-20% and 21-30%), compared to the national data.

This shows that 90 of the 999 LSOAs in Sussex are in the 20% most deprived in the country.

In the previous IMD, there were a comparatively higher number of LSOAs ranking in the top 20% most deprived at 97, indicating that pockets of extreme deprivation have decreased relative to other LSOAs.
